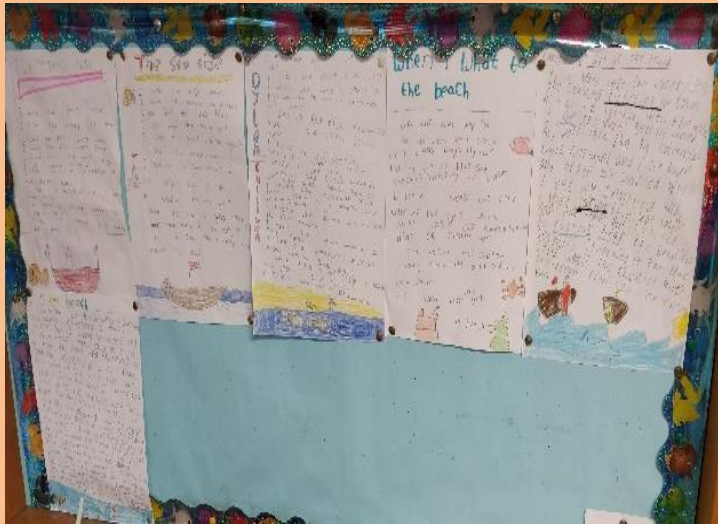

The Parents' Association were very good to us and we all got ice-creams out on the pitch. Thank you very much for such a lovely treat!

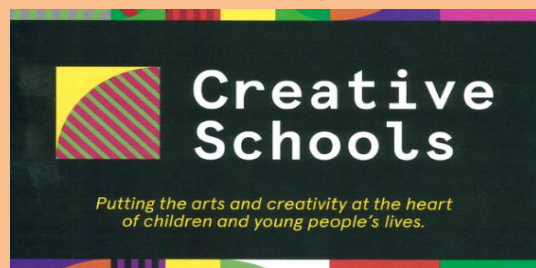

We are delighted to announce the Crosskeys National School is an accredited "Superstar Farm Safe School." Well done to all of the boys and girls for their hard work from April to early June. Thank you to all of the class teachers for organising the initiative.



Summer Improvements to school yard:

The Board of Management have arranged for a number of improvements to the school yard over the summer holidays. The boundary fence next to the parish field will be replaced with child friendly sports fencing. The large non-native trees and hedging will also be removed for safety reasons. This will make for a safer playing space for the children. The Board of Management would like to thank the Parents' Association, as well as current and previous PA Committees for all your excellent fundraising in recent years. *A cheque for €8,000 was recently presented by the PA to the school.* These funds will now go towards the new sports fencing. The Emergency Works Scheme will also allow some of the yard to be resurfaced as well as drainage works to be carried out. Hopefully we get some good news on our pending CLÁR application which will enable even more work on the school yard. It is expected that work will begin in mid-August and last until the school reopens on Tuesday 31st August.



P.E. Uniform: The new P.E. uniform will be available from QuickPick Uniforms in Ballyjamesduff in July. **The only children who will be expected to purchase the new P.E. uniform will be children enrolling in the school from September 2021.** Should any other parents wish to purchase the new uniform for P.E. days they may do so. **All other children will be expected to wear the 'old' P.E. uniform on P.E. days.**

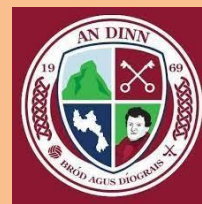


June Jog:
