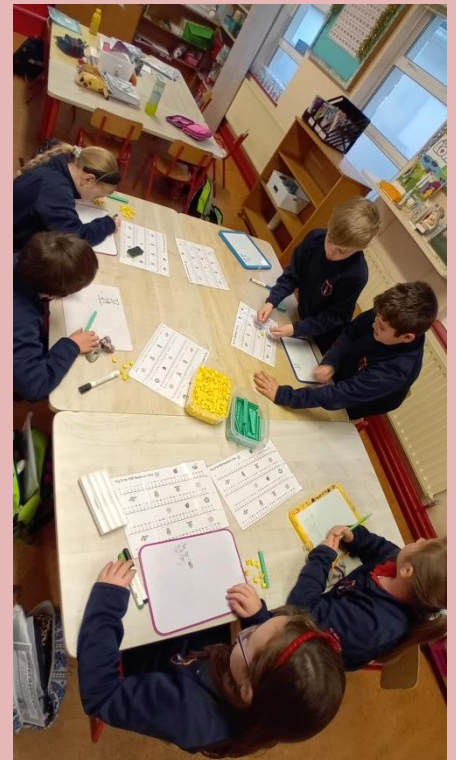
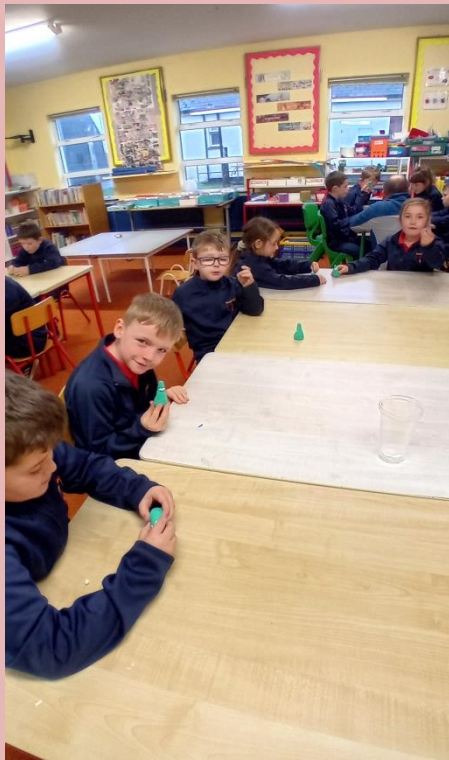

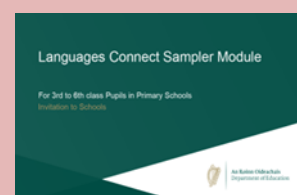

Primary Languages Sampler Module:

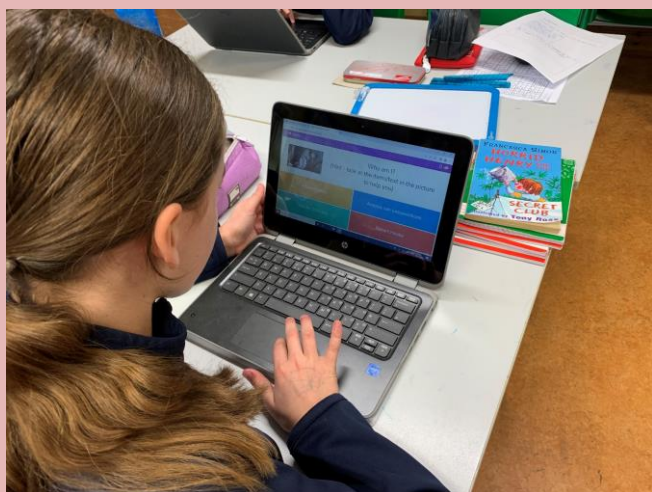

The school choir continues to meet every Wednesday in the 5th/6th classroom.

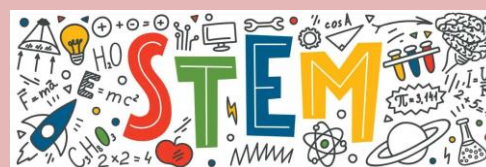
