We're doing very well finding our way around and through the school and are making new friends and reconnecting with old ones after the summer holidays.



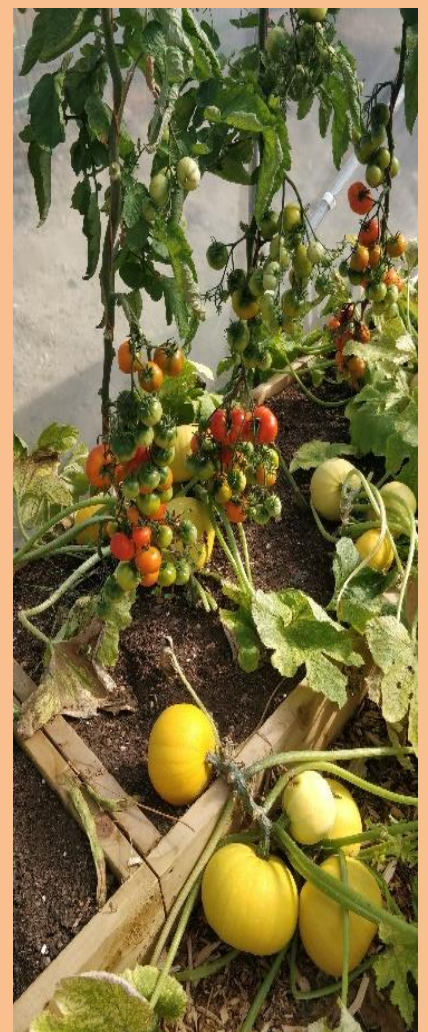

Mass to begin the school Year:

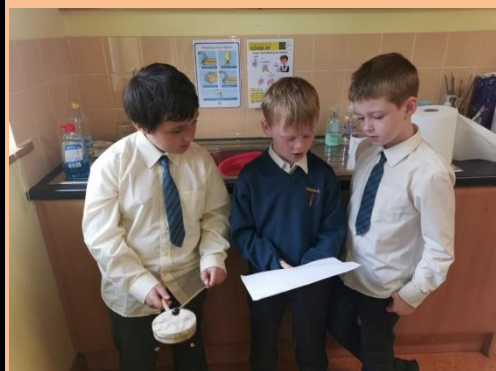
Thanks to Fr. Kilduff who said mass for all pupils and staff in the school hall in the month of September. It was a nice start to the school year.

Board of Management: The Board's next meeting will take place on Monday 24th October at 7.45pm

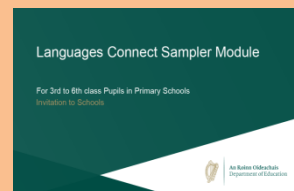
