Peter Crann Drumming workshop and Fanzini the Clown - both part of our Creative Schools Programme.

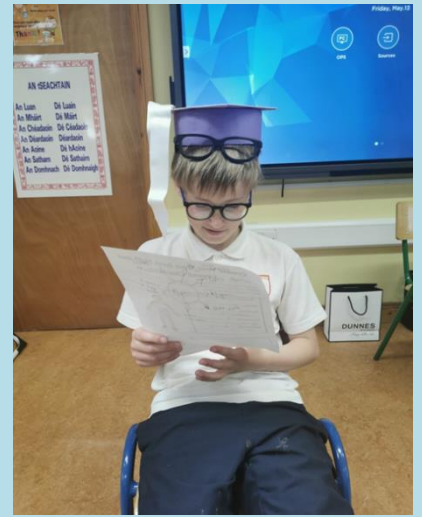
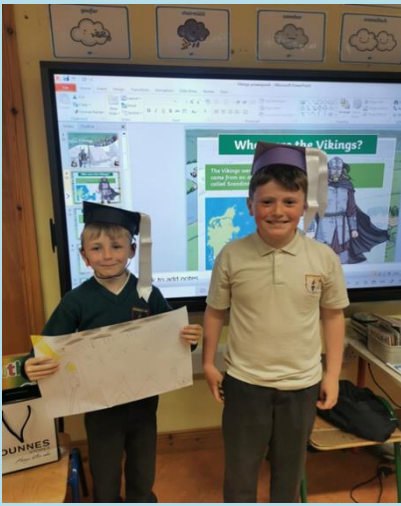
Lots of fun on our new soft play surface and on our new outdoor furniture.

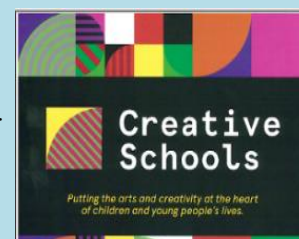


Primary Languages Sampler Module:
